Dear Friend of King's,

I am honored to serve in the role of Head of School at The King's Christian School. I have known of King's during most of my career in Christian school education, having the opportunity to work with Mrs. Peg Savidge and the King's board back in the 1990's. There is such a rich tradition here – since 1946 – to keep the "main thing" the main thing – focused on preparing students to become effective servant-leaders who impact the world. The mission of King's is just as clear today as it has been in the past:

In partnership with Christian parents, The King's Christian School, a K-12, non-denominational, college-preparatory school, equips and strengthens students, through education and example, that they might stand firmly upon the Word of God and become effective servant-leaders who impact the world through their Christian walk.

It is a blessing for me to serve an institution with this focused mission. I am also encouraged to be able to report to you that the Lord has blessed King's this past year, and the future for King's is a bright one, as the Lord continues to provide for this ministry.

In the pages of this report, you will find stories of how the Lord is using King's to impact students and effectively prepare them for future service. There are many moving parts to providing a strong Christian education. One of the most important components is faculty members who are deeply committed to the Lord and to impacting students. King's is blessed with a great blend of new teachers who have received the most current preparation for teaching, as well as experienced veterans who provide wisdom and stability to our faculty team.

Divisional leadership is also a critical component. God has provided King's with a Middle School/High School Principal Craig Beatty ('01 Alumnus), Elementary Principal Jessica Flanagan ('08 Alumna), Finance and Facilities Director Walter Kunz, and Advancement Director Mimi Magill, who are being used by the Lord every day here.

Enrollment has grown to 550 this year, up from enrollment of 325 four years ago (see the chart on p. 11). The financial report on p. 21 shows operating income exceeding expenses. In addition, King's was able to invest \$400,000 in capital expenses to add four new classrooms, along with other improvements.

Although I am encouraged by last year's results, I am even more excited about the great days ahead for King's. We are investing significant efforts into faculty professional development with an emphasis on biblical worldview training. Several donors have stepped up to fund an extensive campus master planning process with a leading educational architectural firm. Curriculum analysis provides direction for additions and changes for next year. Our excellent programs in performing arts and athletics are growing. We anticipate continued enrollment growth leading to full classes in many grades next year.

As you read through these pages, join with us in acknowledging that God is the One who is providing new blessings to King's. I am reminded of Psalm 20:7, "Some trust in chariots and horses, but we trust in the name of the Lord our God." Our trust is not in our own wisdom or efforts, but in the Lord our God.

PRESCHOOL AND ELEMENTARY

Dear TKCS Family,

On September 6, we opened our doors to 307 Preschool/Elementary students. The faculty and staff have been charged with the task of educating these students in order to see them grow academically, socially, and most importantly, spiritually. An elementary teacher plays such a huge role in a child's development. It is not uncommon for a teacher to be mistakenly called mom throughout the day! This close relationship between teacher and student is something we value at TKCS and seek to develop daily.

Over the summer, the faculty and staff read *Beyond Biblical Integration* by Dr. Roger Erdvig. He suggested Christian schools immerse their students with God's Word, similar to Moses' directions to the Israelites in Deuteronomy 11:18-20, "You shall therefore lay up these words of mine in your heart and in your soul, and you shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall teach them to your children, talking of them when you are sitting in your house, and when you are walking by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates." Dr. Erdvig explains the following:


To the ancient Jews, these were much more than miscellaneous laws and dictates that needed to be integrated into real life. God's words formed the unseen foundation from which they were nourished and to which they were anchored – their worldview. To effectively pass on that worldview, parents (and by extension teachers) were told to teach it diligently, to talk about it all the time from morning to night, at home, on the road, and everywhere in between. (Erdvig 27)

As we progress through the 2023-2024 school year, I ask for your prayers for our faculty and staff as they immerse their students in their classrooms with a biblical worldview. This is not an easy task, but it is the most important task we are called to do. Pray that our teachers can continue to develop their personal worldview and grow in their relationship with the Lord. Pray also that our King's students would have receptive hearts to all that the Lord has in store for them.

Thank you for your continued support of the mission at The King's Christian School. We are humbled and blessed to be part of a school that trains up the next generation of servant-leaders who impact the world through their Christian walk.

MIDDLE SCHOOL & HIGH SCHOOL

Dear TKCS Family,

For the 2023-2024 school year, we have 240 students enrolled in our 7th through 12th grades. In addition to the core courses, students chose from electives such as art, handbells, concert choir, concert band, jazz band, art, and theater. For the 2023-2024 school year, students have been able to enroll in Principles of Biblical Leadership, Fitness 101, Introduction to American Sign Language, Physics, Driver's Education, and Middle School Personal Finance. Also new in 2023-2024 is our partnership with the Center for Christian Counseling and Relationship Development. Throughout the year, CCCRD will be providing the middle school and high school with counseling groups, individual counseling, and parent workshops.

Our 11th and 12th grades now have the option to participate in our Dual Enrollment Program with Cairn University. Currently, the dual enrollment course offerings are AP Biology, Advanced Writing, AP Government, US History 2, and Discipleship. After-school programs for our students include soccer, cross country, basketball, cheerleading, softball, baseball, and track and field. We also offer drama and theater, which put on a play or musical every spring. Our goal is to add two more clubs by the end of the 2024 school year. During lunch, students can participate in various clubs, such as The Protector (Anti-bullying) Series, Environmental Club, Boys' Bible Study, and Girls' Bible Study, Chess, Mock UN, and Kingdom Culture Club.

Every Thursday we have Chapel. Chapel is a time where we refocus on what really matters, our relationship with Jesus Christ. Our students lead worship and various speakers open God's Word. Our speakers include college presidents, pastors, missionaries, counselors, and church leaders. Our students also learn the importance of servant leadership by participating in various service projects throughout the school year, such as Operation Christmas Child, local missions, and our Missions Trip program.

I am excited for our continued growth of the middle school and high school student population, as well as our expanding course offerings. I believe that when students graduate from King's, they will be effective servant-leaders who impact the world for Jesus Christ.







We are delighted to feature Leah Welsh for this year's alumni spotlight. Leah graciously shared her story from her days as a student at King's, to her current role as a dedicated preschool teacher within our institution. Notably, her husband, a high school teacher at King's, and their three children, who have all attended King's, exemplify the lasting legacy of TKCS within the Welsh family.

"I am what they call a 'lifer' here at King's. I attended The King's Christian School from kindergarten through 12th grade and graduated in 1996. Our elementary campus was on Kings Highway in Haddon Heights, and our high school was on Covered Bridge Road in Cherry Hill. I loved attending King's. I was involved in field hockey, cheerleading, handbells, choir, student government, art, and yearbook. I had wonderful friendships and great teachers. I value the education, extracurricular experiences, and mentors I had at King's.

"One of the best things about King's for me was the impact teachers made on my life. I had so many great teachers who invested in me. My senior year Bible teacher encouraged me to go to Cairn University (Philadelphia College of Bible at the time). What a gift, because that is where I met my husband! I always knew I wanted to be a teacher and graduated from Cairn in 2000 with a Bachelor of Science in Biblical Studies and early childhood education. I was able to student teach at King's with the kindergarten teacher who had taught me! I think back on my favorite teachers and experiences, and it motivates me to be a great teacher that cares for my students and teaches them in a way they learn best.

"During staff devotions one week this past September, Dr. Dill shared a quote from a book the faculty read this summer, *Beyond Biblical Integration*. It said, 'Consider your classroom more as a place to live and learn with your students than a place where you deliver lessons.' I feel as if I experienced this in a lot of classrooms during my time at King's, and that is what I hope for students to experience now at King's. They are in a classroom with brothers and sisters in Christ, seen and cared for, and being taught all subject matter infused with the gospel.

"My mom, Terri Maines, was the art teacher at King's for 26 years. She left a legacy by starting an art show that still takes place at King's and features student artists. My mom is the most encouraging person in my life. She has inspired many past students to be teachers that continue her passion for art and seeing students push themselves creatively and enjoying the fine arts. I remember attending a Nicole Nordeman concert in 2006 when King's had just purchased this current building. It was in the warehouse where classrooms now stand.





"At that time I didn't know that someday I would be teaching in this school with the largest student body in over a decade, with my own children attending, and with my husband teaching in the high school.

"The chorus of Nicole Nordeman's song 'Legacy' says, 'I want to leave a legacy, How will they remember me? Did I choose to love? Did I point to you enough? To make a mark on things. I want to leave an offering. A child of mercy and grace who blessed your name unapologetically. And leave that kind of legacy.' What a wonderful challenge that gives us as parents, teachers, friends, and followers of Christ.

"So, what does King's mean to me and why did I choose to come back to teach? To leave a legacy. To love, to point others to Christ, to be a blessing."

Leah's life verse is Psalm 143:8, "Let the morning bring me word of your unfailing love, for I have put my trust in you. Show me the way I should go, for to you I entrust my life."

Leah is the preschool director and one of the Pre-K4 teachers here at King's. Her husband Bart is a high school Bible teacher at King's. 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A SHIELD OF PROTECTION



The Latest Security Upgrades at The King's Christian School

King's has made significant investments in strengthening campus security in the past year:

After much discussion and review, King's has added an armed security guard to the campus this year. We contracted with a highly regarded local firm that employs experienced former police officers with current training and licenses. Officer John (pictured) is a pleasant new addition who has gotten to know everything about the building and has also developed relationships with faculty and students. The decision to hire an armed security guard was made in June, and the expense was not budgeted.



This year, each family is paying a new security fee of \$375.

- New secure doors at both main entrances.
- New alarm system with direct, immediate notification to the Cherry Hill Police Department.
- Ongoing annual safety and evacuation training for faculty and staff.
- Additional security cameras at entrances and throughout the campus; there are 48 cameras inside and outside our building.
- The Security Advisory Committee, made up of parents and grandparents with significant experience
 in security issues, was established in June. This committee conducted the interview process with
 security firms and fully endorsed our armed security guard selection and guidelines. The committee
 makes recommendations to the King's administration. They are also advising the administration in
 developing a comprehensive Emergency Operations Plan (EOP).
- Strengthened relationship with Cherry Hill Fire and Police Departments, including joint drills at King's.
- A new visitor registration system will be installed in November that requires each visitor to use their driver's license to register before coming into the building.
- Our most important strategy: continued prayer and dependence upon the Lord for protection.

FINANCIAL REPORT

2022-23 Fiscal Year Summary

Significant enrollment growth was the primary factor resulting in large increases in both revenue and expense as compared to the prior year of 2021-22, as shown on the chart below.

Our significant enrollment increase also required additional financial assistance for families not able to pay full tuition. The following pie charts summarize our revenue and expenses for last year. Note that tuition and fees provide nearly 92% of our revenue, while our primary expense is providing salary and benefits for our employees, representing over two-thirds (68%) of our expenditure. Depreciation of \$307,905 is a non-cash expense. TKCS also incurred unbudgeted expenses of approximately \$122,000 for facilities, teachers, and the Timothy Program during the 2022-23 school year.

The bottom line of these charts is that God has blessed King's with significant growth, which has continued into the current 2023-24 school year with an enrollment of 550. We are grateful that the Lord is providing the resources needed to provide Christ-centered education to a growing number of students.




